New Qualification at Anamata!

The **Diploma in Applied Māori Health Coexisting Disorders Level 6** is a new qualification now being offered by Anamata.

The Anamata Coexisting Disorders programme is the first kaupapa Māori based qualification in addictions to be offered to the hauora workforce. Enrolled students will attend monthly three day wānanga in Rotorua. Participants will receive current research material in addictions and have specialists deliver lectures in their field. This is a NZQA recognised qualification with DAPPANZ accreditation pending.
